







YIT has zero tolerance for corruption, the grey economy and labour exploitation. People who work at our sites include our workers as well as our contractors and their subcontractors' workers. The well-being of workers is the foundation of everything we do, and we demand that everyone respects people's human rights.



Signs of labour exploitation:

- √ No written employment contract
- √ Long working days without a separate agreement, lots of weekend and night time work
- √ Not enough breaks
- √ Inadequate records of working hours
- √ Incorrect worker/employer information on VALTTI card
- √ Too many persons in the same shared accommodation
- √ The worker has paid to get the job, or the worker is in debt to the recruiter or employer
- √ The employer charges for commuting and/or accommodation
- √ The worker's passport or other personal documents are held by the employer
